Gold exploration to begin

Kalamazoo Resources Limited has completed the sale of its Snake Well Gold Project in Western Australia and has signalled its intention to begin focusing on its Wattle Gully Gold Project in Castlemaine.

The \$7 million sale sees the company well placed to fund its exploration and drilling programs for the next two years at Castlemaine, the Cork Tree Copper Project in Western Australia, and its Pilbara gold tenements.

The Mail met with Kalamazoo exploration manager Luke Mortimer and field supervisor Mark Reinehr this week to discuss the company's plans for the Castlemaine project.

The company announced it had acquired the exploration licence for the Wattle Gully Gold Project in June 2018 and has also submitted an application for a second tenement south of the existing Wattle Gully tenement which it hopes will be approved this year.

The two tenements cover an area of 280 square kilometres from just south of Harcourt to just north of Glenlyon.

"We would describe the project as 'greenfields'. It is in the very early stages. We have no plans to reopen Wattle Gully Mine at this stage, but never say never. We are looking for a high-grade rich deposit," Mr Mortimer said.

The company is already on the ground beginning the process of moving former core samples from the Chewton mine to a secure location in Castlemaine and plans to begin geological mapping, rock and soil sampling over the coming months. Mr Mortimer said the company plan to conduct some drilling on potential target sites on the northern tenement in late 2019.

"We aim to keep our exploration within the pine plantation, Castlemaine Diggings National Heritage Park and state park where possible and look to avoid people," he said.

"We are very aware about community concerns regarding our presence and that they feel very strongly about heritage

sites and we have taken this on board.

"We would like to assure the community that we are required to work within strict rules and regulations, we are not allowed to touch heritage or indigenous sites and we are subject to requirements to fully rehabilitate drill sites," he

Mr Mortimer said that the company's goal is to discover and emulate Fosterville up the road, one of the richest gold mines in Australia, and if it was lucky enough to do so any future mining would be deep underground.

"We definitely would not be looking at open cut mining,"

Mr Mortimer said that the Castlemaine Goldfields, renowned as the world's richest alluvial goldfield, generated 5 million ounces of gold. In today's terms that would equate to
